Paul writes to us all, "I am writing you these instructions so that you will know how people ought to conduct themselves in God's household, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the truth."

All worship staff and servant leaders are expected to observe and to embody, with the help of the Holy Spirit, the following requirements for biblical servant leadership:

- · Live above reproach.
- If married, be the husband of one wife or the wife of one husband.
- Be sober-minded or disciplined.
- · Be respectable, well thought of by outsiders.
- · Be hospitable.
- · Be able to teach.
- Don't be a drunkard. (controlled by alcohol)
- · Don't be violent or quick-tempered but gentle.
- · Don't be arrogant or conceited.
- Don't be a lover of money.
- Be a good husband/father or wife/mother.
- · Be a lover of what is good, upright and holy.

BASS GUITAR

<u>BASS</u> GUITAR

Bass players are required to learn the notes, patterns and feel as they are on the recordings. Players are expected to have a quality instrument with excellent tone. Excellent tone is accomplished through both great gear and great technique.

Bassists should have the ability to use four fingers on the fret board as well as at least two fingers plucking the strings.

Aside from just learning the parts as they are on the recordings provided, bassists need to be able to play with a click and help create the pocket with the drummer.

<u>ELECTRIC</u> GUITAR

Electric guitarists are required to learn the actual parts of the songs posted while matching the tones and effects for each part as they are on the recording. We love the unique and personal expression of each individual player, but here are some guidelines to follow in order to contribute well from the very beginning of your time playing at LifePoint.

THE GUITAR

Players should first and foremost have a good quality guitar. Suggested brands include Fender, Gretsch, Gibson, just to name a few. Brands such as Schecter, Dean, ESP and others like these are great for their respective styles, however, they usually won't work well for what we do.

The quality of the guitar is as important as the sound. A reliable and great playing guitar that is well set-up helps prepare you to be more consistent.

THE PEDALS

Effects pedals help to create and shape the sounds that you will need when playing worship songs. Compressors, delays, reverbs, overdrives, modulation, boosts, etc. give you the tools to craft quality sounding lead lines, hooks, and atmospheric textures. Individual stomp boxes from companies like Strymon, JHS, Eventide, TC Electronics and Electro Harmonix (just to name a few) are great.

DRUMS

Drummers are expected to learn groove, patterns and maps from the recordings while also being flexible to change the parts if asked to do so. We emphasize simple, musical playing with an aggressive approach and a high value on consistency. Technique, dynamics, groove and timing are all areas where we expect consistency. Drummers are expected to play tightly with a click/metronome.

All drums, hardware, snare and cymbals are provided. You are required to bring your own sticks. You are also more than welcome to bring your own snare, cymbals and pedal, however you will need to work with the FOH engineer to determine the usability with our systems.

Drummers will run all clicks and tracks via the provided rig (computer/interface) using Ableton Live. We will gladly offer you free training on Ableton Live and how we specifically use it for our services.

<u>KEYS AND</u> Plano

Each LifePoint venue will have a provided keyboard. Players are expected to learn the parts from the recordings, play the proper voicings and consistently work with guitarists, making sure to occupy the correct frequency ranges. If there is a "piano" and a "keys" position, players must work together to determine parts and sounds.

It is not required, but it is preferred that keys players have a powerful computer running sounds from software like MainStage, Omnishpere, Keyscape, etc.

VOCALS

Vocalists are joining a team, an ensemble of singers with a shared goal of learning and creating a cohesive sound and becoming one unified voice for congregational worship. Vocalists are therefore expected to remain flexible and receptive to further coaching and direction from appropriate leadership. Vocalists should be able to blend with other vocalists.

Vocalists are required to attend specific scheduled vocal trainings. Communication will be sent out as necessary.

All servant leaders are strongly encouraged to own their own in-ear monitors.

All musicians are required (and vocalists are strongly encouraged) to read chord charts written in the style of the Nashville Number System.

DRESS CODE

WOMEN

- Avoid tight patterns and bright colors, as they don't translate well on a camera. Tight patterns get distorted and bright colors are even brighter.
- Dresses, skirts, jeans, pants, shirts and blouses are all acceptable. When wearing skirts or dresses, please make sure the bottom comes down to your knee (when hands raised). If you wear tights or leggings, please wear a top that comes down approximately 2 inches above your knee. (We don't want to police any of this. Please use sound judgment)
- Please make sure that shirts are modest, as well.
 No low-cut necklines. Nothing see-through.
 (really light colors, lace, etc.)
- · No flip-flops.

MEN

- Avoid tight patterns and bright colors, as they don't translate well on a camera. Tight patterns get distorted and bright colors are even brighter.
- Collared shirts, nice t-shirts, sweaters, etc. are all allowed. Please no super deep V-necks. (nobody wants to see your chest hair)
- Nice jeans/pants
- · No flip-flops.
